Infant

Add a toy wa'a to your infant's bath time. Encourage them to push the wa'a around in the water. Teach them new words like wa'a and water. This encourages water play and fosters language development.

Toddler

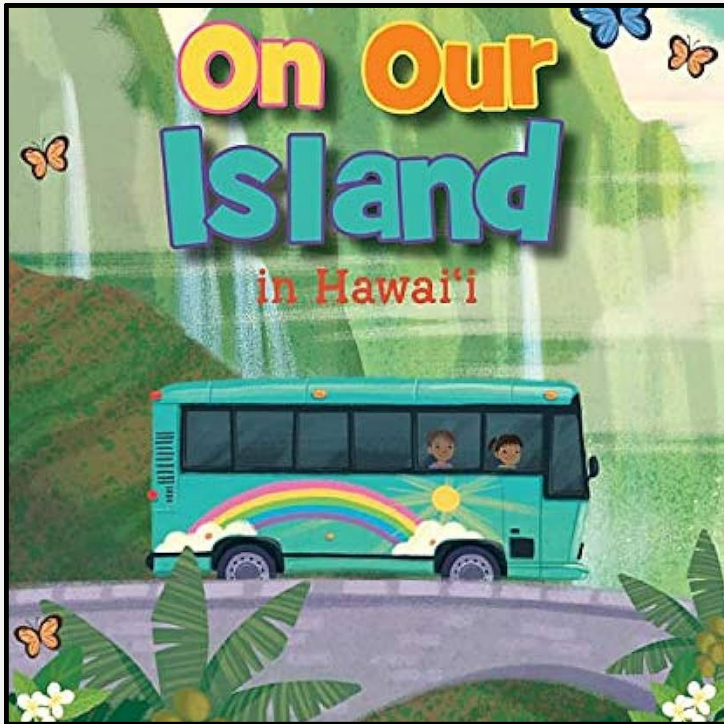
Use a small plastic bowl as a wa'a. Invite your toddler to place items in the bowl to represent people. Place the bowl in a larger container of water. Invite your toddler to help the wa'a sail in the water. Keiki learn about their world by using their senses.

Preschooler

Help your preschooler cut out different shapes, e.g., triangles, half-circles, squares, and rectangles, and glue them to a plain piece of paper to create a wa'a. Talk about how wa'a are a way of transportation for people and things. Exploring shapes and combining them to form new shapes is a foundational geometry skill.

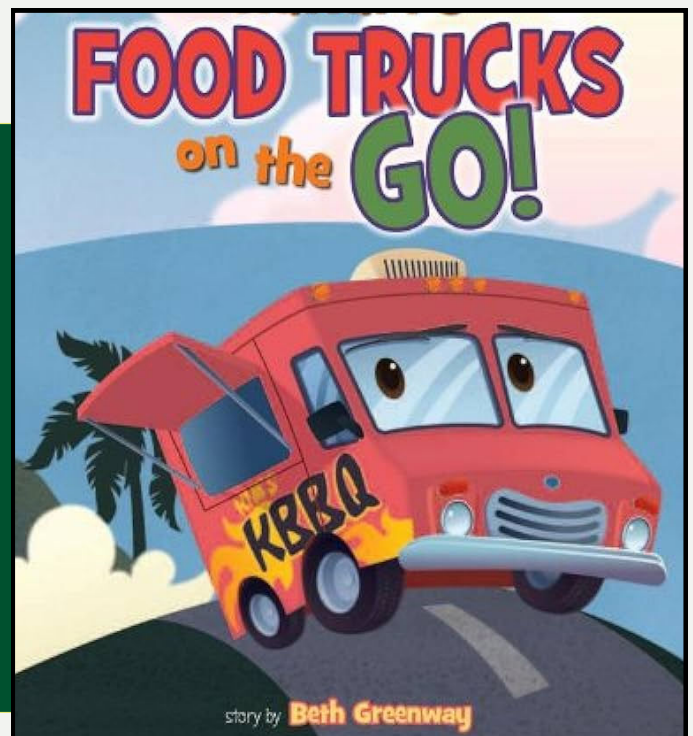
